Dear Mr. Morrissy:

This is to inform you that the remains of your loved one have been permanently interred, as recorded above, side by side with comrades who also gave their lives for their country. Customary military funeral services were conducted over the grave at the time of burial.

After the Department of the Army has completed all final interments, the cemetery will be transferred, as authorized by the Congress, to the care and supervision of the American Battle Monuments Commission. The Commission also will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cemetery, including erection of the permanent headstone. The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. Any inquiries relative to the type of headstone or the spelling of the name to be inscribed thereon, should be addressed to the American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington 25, D. C. Your letter should include the full name, rank, serial number, grave location, and name of the cemetery.

While interments are in progress, the cemetery will not be open to visitors. You may rest assured that this final interment was conducted with fitting dignity and solemnity and that the grave-site will be carefully and conscientiously maintained in perpetuity by the United States Government.

Reference is made to your inquiry addressed to Major General Edward F. Witsell, and referred here for reply, in behalf of Mrs. James F. Morrissy, 131 Burget Avenue, Medford, Massachusetts, regarding the burial of her son, Corporal Terrance F. Morrissy, 31356271.

It is hoped that it will be of some comfort to Mrs. Morrissy to know that her son was interred in the United States Military Cemetery at Solers, France, in Plot D, Row 5, Grave 90. This cemetery is located approximately sixteen miles southeast of Paris and ten miles north and slightly east of Melun, both in France.

Mrs. Morrissy may be assured that her son was buried with the utmost respect and reverence, with an appropriate ceremony conducted at the grave by an Army Chaplain. One identification tag was buried with the remains and the other attached to the temporary marker at the head of the grave. The Cemetery is well cared for and under the direct supervision of our military authorities.

Immediate plans are being formulated with a view to returning to the next of kin the remains of their loved ones. It is contemplated that, within the near future, this office will communicate with the next of kin to ascertain their wishes regarding the disposition of the remains. All expenses incident to the preparation, casketing and shipment of the remains to the place thus designated will be borne by the Government. The mission, as a whole, is worldwide in scope and, of necessity, time consuming.

Lieutenant General Edward B. Gregory, The Quartermaster General, desires to express through you to the family of Corporal Morrissy his deepest sympathy in their great sorrow.

This cemetery is about 16 miles southeast of Paris and 10 miles north and slightly east of Melun, both in France.



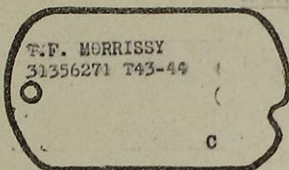
