MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, Casualty Branch.

SUBJECT: Review and Determination of Status
under the Missing Persons Act.

I - FACTS

1. The persons named below were reported missing in action over France by ETO Casualty Car Shipment No. 042 and have been carried on War Department records as missing in action since 10 April 1944:

2. Missing Air Crew Report No. 3747 dated 12 April 1944 shows that the persons named in paragraph 1 above were members of the 416th Bomb Group, 671 Bomb Squadron and that they constituted the crew of A-20G-30 aircraft No. 43-9699. This plane took part in an operational mission to Bois des Huitrues France. It was last contacted over the North Sea at 1020 hours, on the return trip. It was then flying with single engine at approximately 400 feet altitude. The pilot, Lieutenant Cramsie, requested bearing from Bradwell Bay, England. He was heard by First Lieutenant Marion S. Street, 026323, and another pilot in the same flight, to acknowledge the reply. Lieutenant Street was 15 miles off the English coast at the time he intercepted the message. A map attached to the missing crew report is marked to show that the last known whereabouts of Lieutenant Cramsie's plane was at the coordinates of approximately 51° 40' North - 1° 50' East, about 40 miles off shore east of Bradwell Bay, England. No search was made by the Group.

3. Files of these persons in Casualty Branch, Officers Branch and Enlisted Branch have been examined, also index in Prisoner of War Information Bureau, PMGO. The AGO Form 20's of the enlisted men concerned show that the target was near Hazebrouck, France, that no enemy aircraft were

destroyed, and that the plane in question left the French coast near La Panne, France. No other information pertinent to the present review and disclosed except as shown herein.

II - CONCLUSIONS

1. This case concerns an A-20 (Havoc) aircraft which took part in a mission over France on 10 April 1944. Official War Department records show that on that date allied aircraft carried out round-the-clock attacks on enemy airdromes, aircraft factories, coastal defenses, and railroad yards.

2. The aircraft in question was last contacted over the North Sea approximately 40 miles east of Bradwell Bay which is located near the mouth of the Thames River. At that time it was flying on one engine.

3. No word has been received from or about these persons in the twelve months which have elapsed, and, in view of the foregoing, they may not reasonably be presumed to be living.

III - RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that findings of death be made under the provisions of section 5 of the Missing Persons Act in the cases of the persons named in paragraph 1 above and that these findings show 11 April 1945 as the presumed date of death.

SUBJECT: Report of Death

1. The following-named Air Corps personnel were reported missing in action 10 April 1944, while in flying pay status, by ETO Shipment No. 042:

1st Lt	Cramsie, William E.	025895
S Sgt	Henshaw, Charles R.	32452886
S Sgt	Steward, Jack	18097398

2. Findings of Death were made in the cases of the above-named persons under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Persons Act by S. R. & D. No. 2724, showing the presumed date of death as 11 April 1945.

3. Missing Air Crew Report No. 3747, submitted by the 671st Bombardment Squadron, 416th Bombardment Group on 12 April 1944, identifies subject personnel as the crew of A-20 aircraft No. 43-9699 which was lost on an operational mission to Bois des Hutries, France, on 10 April 1944. The plane was last contacted at 1020 hours over the English Channel on the return trip, and its loss was attributed to enemy antiaircraft. It was then flying with single engine at 400 feet altitude. The pilot, Lt Cramsie, requested bearing from Bradwell Bay and acknowledged the reply. The officer hearing the acknowledgement was 15 miles off the English Coast at the time he intercepted the message. Lt Cramsie's last known position is indicated on a map attached to the Report at the coordinates 51° 40' N - 01° 50' E, about 40 miles off the English Coast. No search was conducted by the Group. Bradwell Bay is shown on the aforementioned map as off the mouth of the Thames River, between Margate and Clacton on Sea, England.

4. Captured German Records from Interrogation Center, have been searched but contain no reference to subject persons.

5. The aircraft of which subject personnel comprised the crew was last contacted by radio approximately 40 miles off the coast of England while returning from a mission to France. Since no records are available which indicate that the bodies of any of the personnel were found, it is only reasonable to assume that the aircraft either crashed or ditched in the North Sea at the approximate position where the message was intercepted and that the crew were either killed in the crash or died after landing in the North Sea at a point too far distant from land to permit rescue. This view is further strengthened by the knowledge

that over three years have elapsed since these men became missing during which time no report has been received in the War Department to indicate that they are alive.

6. It is recommended, therefore, that pursuant to the provisions of Section 9, Missing Person Act, the foregoing information be accepted as an official report of death, and that a casualty report be initiated stating that each person named in paragraph 1, above, was killed in action 10 April 1944, in the North Sea, approximately 40 miles off the coast of England, and that they were in flying pay status. The systemat will be processed in accordance with Paragraph 2 b, Operations Bulletin 35, 1945. The casualty report and official report of death will include the following statement:

Finding of Death has been issued previously under Section 5, Public Law 490, 7 March 1942, as amended, showing presumed date of death as 11 April 1945. This "Report of Death" based on information received since that date, is issued in accordance with Section 9 of said Act and its effect on prior payments and settlements is as provided in Section 9.

SYNOPSIS OF CASE: Aircraft A-20 #43-9699 took part in an operational mission to Bois des Huitrues, France. It was last contacted over the North Sea at 1020 hours, on the return trip. It was then flying with single engine at approximately 400 feet altitude. The pilot requested bearing from Bradwell Bay, England. He was heard by 1st Lt Marion S. Street, O 26 323, another pilot in the same flight, to acknowledge the reply. Lt Street was 15 miles off the English coast at the time he intercepted the message. The last known whereabouts of Lt Gramsie's plane was at coordinates of approximately 51°40'N-1050'E about 40 miles off shore East of Bradley Bay. No search was made at the time. No additional information is available.

Reference is made to MACR #329.

2. Every effort has been made to correlate this case with records in this headquarters pertaining to unknown deceased interred in US Military Cemeteries and reported isolated burials.

3. It is recommended that the remains, based upon the above information and research, be declared non-recoverable.

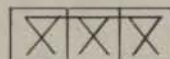

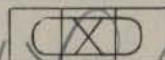
