


GROUP BURIAL

This Office desires to advise you of the conclusion of the lengthy investigation conducted by the American Graves Registration Service for the recovery and identification of the remains of your _____, the late _____. In order that you may be informed of the pertinent facts in connection with the identification, the following is a brief resume of the information on record in your _____'s file maintained by this Office.

The records of the Department of the Army indicate that he was a crew member of an A-20 type aircraft, number 43-10129, which was lost in the target area as a result of enemy anti-aircraft fire while on a combat mission to Beauvoir, France on 12 May 1944. ^{Two} of the crew members manifested aboard the plane were killed and one was captured by the Germans and transferred to a prisoner of war camp.

Captured enemy military records on file in this Office include a report of the downing of your _____'s aircraft on 12 May 1944 approximately 1 1/2 kilometers southwest of Beauvoir. The deceased crew members were reported as buried in the English Cemetery at St. Pol, France.

In the course of search and recovery operations by the American Graves Registration Service in France, the remains of American airmen, reported by the enemy to have been buried in the English Cemetery at St. Pol, (St. Pol-sur-Fernoise), were exhumed and removed to a United States Military Cemetery, pending a complete investigation. While tentative associations were made on the basis of enemy military records, it was learned through interrogation of the civilians that during the German occupation, the civil authorities and cemetery caretaker were not adequately informed as to the identity or place and date of death of the American deceased who were taken to the cemetery for burial by the German military.

During the extensive examinations and investigations in this case, the remains

were examined in our Central Identification Laboratory by an accredited anthropologist; however, the incomplete condition of the remains of some of the deceased airmen was such as to preclude any basis for individual identifications. Therefore, the remains, now placed in sixteen caskets, have been established as a group burial of the only recoverable remains of ^{your son} ~~Staff Sergeant Foster and Flight Lieutenant Stockwell, post-~~ and one of his fellow crew members, as well as the individually unidentifiable remains of fifteen deceased crew members of eight other American aircraft which crashed near St. Pol and whose remains were removed to the English Cemetery at St. Pol for burial.

I wish to express my appreciation for your patience during the conduct of our long and time-consuming investigation. However, I am sure you are cognizant of the difficulties which were to be surmounted before any information of a definite nature could be furnished.

Information received from the German government, through the International Red Cross, indicates that Lieutenant Stockwell's remains were buried in a cemetery in St. Pol, France. This information, however, has not as yet been verified by our Graves Registration Service. An investigation is being conducted in an effort to obtain an official report of burial and you are assured that as soon as a report is received you will be notified.

It may be a consolation to Mrs. Stockwell to know that plans are being formulated with a view to returning to the next of kin the remains of their loved ones. It is contemplated that, within the near future, this office will communicate with the next of kin to ascertain their wishes regarding the disposition of the remains. All expenses incident to the preparation, casketing and shipment of the remains to the place thus designated will be borne by the Government.

The Quartermaster General, Lieutenant General E. S. Gregory, desires to express through you to Mrs. Stockwell his deepest sympathy in the loss of her son.

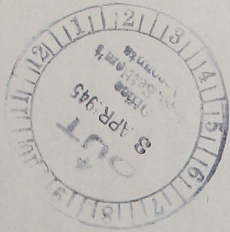

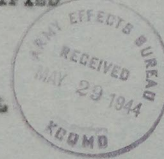
