Dear Mrs. Moore:

This is to inform you that the remains of your loved one have been permanently interred, as recorded above, side by side with comrades who also gave their lives for their country. Customary military funeral services were conducted over the grave at the time of burial.

After the Department of the Army has completed all final interments, the cemetery will be transferred, as authorized by the Congress, to the care and supervision of the American Battle Monuments Commission. The Commission also will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cemetery, including erection of the permanent headstone. The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. Any inquiries relative to the type of headstone or the spelling of the name to be inscribed thereon, should be addressed to the American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington 25, D. C. Your letter should include the full name, rank, serial number, grave location, and name of the cemetery.

While interments are in progress, the cemetery will not be open to visitors. You may rest assured that this final interment was conducted with fitting dignity and solemnity and that the grave-site will be carefully and conscientiously maintained in perpetuity by the United States Government.

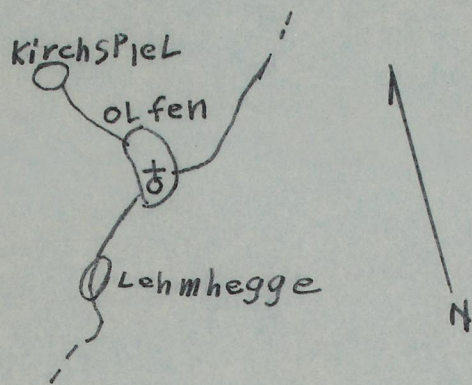

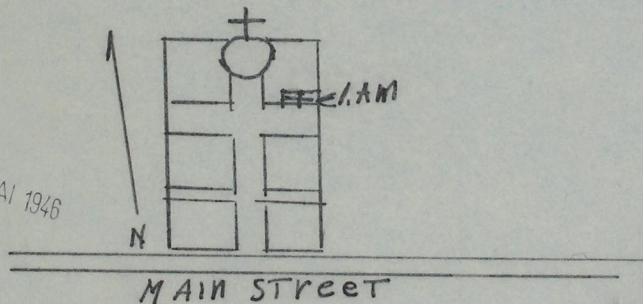

Please be assured that the Department of the Army will comply with your desire to have the remains of your son permanently interred in the United States Military Cemetery, Neuville-en-Condroz, Belgium.

I am sure you will understand that it may be necessary to move the remains of your son during the permanent beautification and consolidation of the cemetery as a shrine in grateful remembrance of our honored dead of World War II.

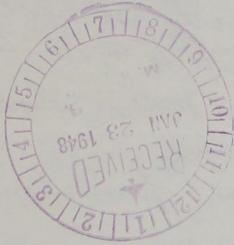

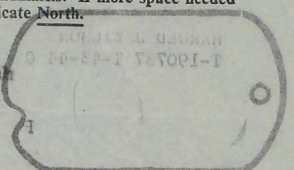

Your letter to Headquarters, Army Air Forces, concerning your son, the late Flight Officer Harold J. Wilson, has been referred to this office.

The German burial report, received in this office through captured enemy records, indicates that the remains of your son were interred in Olfen, Germany. When this reported burial has been verified by the American Graves Registration Service, and your son's remains have been removed to an established American Cemetery, you will be advised.

The War Department has now been authorized to remove, at Government expense, to the final resting place designated by the next of kin, the remains of those American citizens who died while serving overseas with our armed forces during this war.

When the necessary preliminaries have been completed, a letter with an information pamphlet and a "Request for Disposition" form attached will be sent to the next of kin of those American dead. The "Request for Disposition" form, when properly filled out, will constitute the formal expression of the next of kin's detailed desires. Since letters to next of kin will be dispatched automatically and according to the records here, communications with this office regarding this subject will not be necessary.

As you probably know, the supply of steel for the manufacture of caskets is at present uncertain. Without this essential item, the movement of remains cannot properly be initiated. This fact and the necessity for complete coordination of movement in many parts of the world make it impossible, at this time, to estimate when these forms will be mailed. Responses to them will be acted upon with a minimum of delay.

Dear Mrs. Moore:

I am writing to you in reference to your son who gave his life in the service of his Country during the European conflict.

In an effort to furnish the next of kin with all available details concerning casualties among our personnel, the Army Air Forces recently completed the translation of several volumes of captured German records.

In regard to Flight Officer Harold J. Wilson, these records indicate that he was killed in action on 16 February 1945, when his A-26 (Invader) bomber was shot down by enemy antiaircraft fire and crashed at Eversum, near Olfen (51° 42' North Latitude, 7° 23' East Longitude), Germany. These records further indicate that his body, having been recovered, was interred in the cemetery of Olfen, grave three.

The Quartermaster General in his capacity as Chief, American Graves Registration Service, is charged with the responsibility of notifying the legal next of kin concerning grave locations of members of the military forces who are killed or die outside the continental limits of the United States. If the report of your son's burial has not been confirmed and you have not been notified by the Quartermaster General, that official will furnish you definite information immediately upon receipt of the official report of interment from the Commanding General of the Theater concerned.

May the knowledge of your son's valuable contribution to our cause sustain you in your bereavement.

Dear Sir:

In reply to your letter on the other side of this sheet, concerning the check I ask you to make to see if my son Harold J. Wilson had bought Bonds. I did not mean bonds which he might have bought that were deducted from his pay, as I knew that he didn't buy them that way. But he did buy four one hundred dollar bonds made out to himself or (on Feb 1, 1945) Olive J. Dimling, which he bought outright and paid cash for. I finally got them located and turned same over to Miss Dimling. But there was still \$500.00 in cash which he had just a few days before he was killed, and which he told a friend and comrade of his who returned home safely and who told me, that he was buying some bonds with it. That is what I wanted you to check for. As only \$40.00 in cash was returned to me thru the personal Effects Bureau, I am sure that he purchased bonds with it and paid cash for them. So, they wouldn't be deducted from his pay. They would have been sent to his name Harold J. Wilson, 656 St. Clair Drive, Warren, Ohio. That was his address when he left for overseas. I was away from Warren temporarily, and changed his and my address. By mistake at the Post Office here they sent some of his and my mail up to Mrs. Campbell's address at 656 St. Clair Drive instead of changing it. She held and opened the bonds which were made out to Olive J. Dimling and one made out to me for over a year, by my attorney putting on pressure she turned these five bonds over. The fact that I never received the \$500.00 thru the Personal Effects Bureau, I felt that the bonds might have went to 656 St. Clair Drive, Warren, Ohio (Mrs. Mabel Campbell's Home) and that she might have destroyed them. For I have had a lot of trouble with her trying to hold my son's personal effects and the above bonds which I mentioned that went to her address due to the negligence of the Post Office here in Warren, failing to send them to the change of address I gave them.

So please understand that the bonds I am trying to locate would not be deducted from his pay but bought outright with cash by him the last of January or first of February 1945. If Mrs. Campbell has destroyed them or they have been lost otherwise, could you not check the list of bonds he bought and send me a list of the numbers of them and I could check it against the numbers of the bonds which I have had in the settling of his estate. If they had been lost or destroyed I could have a duplicate made.

Hoping this is clear to you and that I will hear from you soon in regard to it, Thanking you in advance for the same.

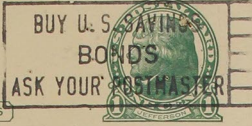

I am inclosing a check for \$30.61 representing funds of your son, Flight Officer Harold J. Wilson.

No other property belonging to him has been received at the Army Effects Bureau to date.

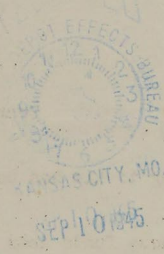
