Oprep A Number 57a for 24 hours ending sunset 27 May 1944. Mission Number 58. IX Bomber Command Field Order Number 332.

- A. Formation consisted of two boxes, 19 ships each box, with the last 3 ships in each flight and 3 ships preceding formation dispensing window. Time of take off was 1853. Time over target 2036. Target - Amiens M/Y. Box 1, at 11,300 feet, dropped a total of 75 bombs, the majority of which were released prematurely on bomb run when a direct flak hit caused release of bombs of one ship with the result that 2 flights released under mistaken impression box leader had dropped. Box 2, at 11,000 feet, dropped a total of 75 bombs in the target area with fair results. Visibility was 8 to 10 miles with no low or medium clouds. Anti-aircraft fire was intense heavy accurate flak from 6 miles southwest of target to 2 mile s north of target continuing throughout, resulting in losses and damages in box 1 only. No enemy aircraft encountered. Planes landed at 2228.
