Dear Mrs. Clark:

Your recent letter concerning final interment of the remains of the group including your son, the late First Lieutenant Hiram B. Clark, has been received.

Under the provisions of Public Law 368, 80th Congress, amending Public Law 388, 79th Congress, The Quartermaster General is authorized to designate the national cemetery in which group or mass interments will be made. It was necessary for the Army to establish a procedure in these cases which would assure equal consideration for all families concerned. The method adopted for the disposition of group remains, where individual identification of such remains cannot be established, is to select a national cemetery for final burial, the geographical location of which distributes as equitably as possible the travel burden upon all next of kin involved. In accordance with this policy, the Fort McPherson National Cemetery, Maxwell, Nebraska was designated for final interment of the remains represented in this group.

Unless the next of kin of each decedent in the group voluntarily requests that final burial be made in a specific national cemetery, consideration cannot be given to any individual request for change. Although it is your desire that final interment be made in the Arlington National Cemetery, a similar request has not been received from the next of kin of the other decedent whose remains form a part of the group. Should the next of kin concerned notify this office it is their desire that burial be accomplished in the Arlington National Cemetery, you may be assured that necessary action will be taken to comply with your mutual requests, if interment has not already been made. Otherwise, final interment will be made in the Fort McPherson National Cemetery, Maxwell, Nebraska as originally designated.
