Dear Mrs. Rice:

This is to inform you that the remains of your loved one have been permanently interred, as recorded above, side by side with comrades who also gave their lives for their country. Customary military funeral services were conducted over the grave at the time of burial.

After the Department of the Army has completed all final interments, the cemetery will be transferred, as authorized by the Congress, to the care and supervision of the American Battle Monuments Commission. The Commission also will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cemetery, including erection of the permanent headstone. The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. Any inquiries relative to the type of headstone or the spelling of the name to be inscribed thereon, should be addressed to the American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington 25, D. C. Your letter should include the full name, rank, serial number, grave location, and name of the cemetery.

While interments are in progress, the cemetery will not be open to visitors. You may rest assured that this final interment was conducted with fitting dignity and solemnity and that the grave-site will be carefully and conscientiously maintained in perpetuity by the United States Government.

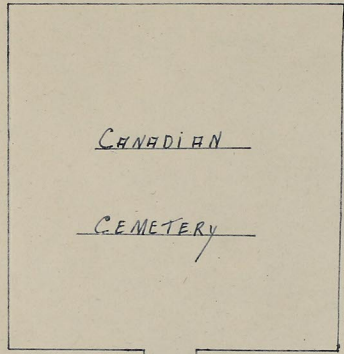

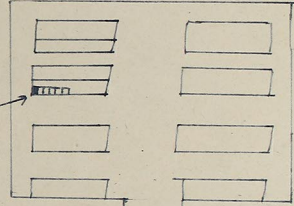



1. Investigations conducted in and near Bergen op Zoom for the remains of S/Sgt Roger W. Rice and S/Sgt. Clay E. Young gave the following results:

- a. The remains of S/Sgt Rice were found buried in the British Cemetery of Bergen op Zoom. The remains have been disinterred and forwarded to the Central Identification Point for further processing and reburial in a U.S. Military Cemetery.
- b. No trace could be found of S/Sgt Young. The remains in grave 99 of the German Cemetery of Bergen op Zoom were previously disinterred by the English and identified as J. Ball, 6016394 of the Royal Irish Fuseliers. Upon investigating the town of Rilland-Bath mentioned as place of death on the German Records it was found that the people knew of the plane-crash but not of the disposition of those killed in the plane.

2. All unknown Allied Airmen in the Canadian Cemetery of Bergen op Zoom were exhumed in an attempt to find S/Sgt Young. All remains disinterred proved to be British.

3. The German Cemetery of Bergen op Zoom has been cleared of all Allied remains leaving the possibility that the remains of S/Sgt Young were removed as unknown.

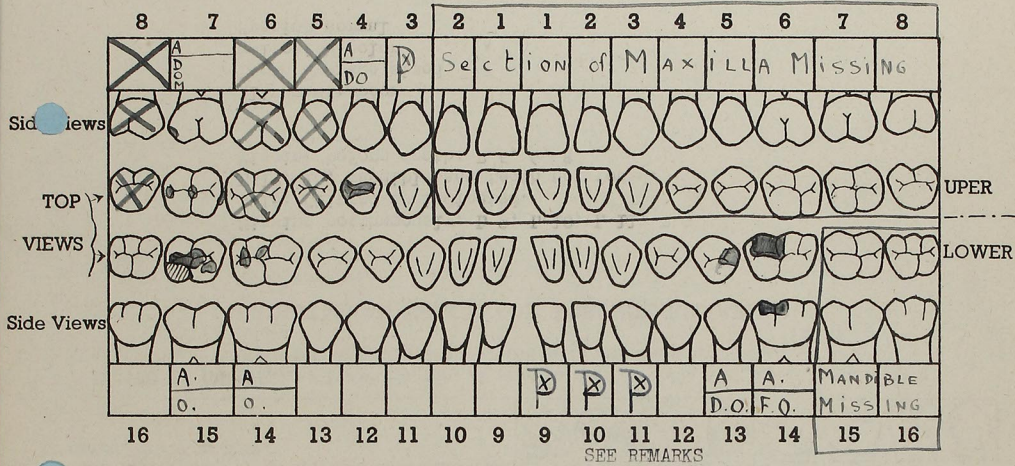

Acting on information contained in Holland case 2203 I went to Bergen-op-Zoom to investigate in an attempt to find the remains of S/Sgt Young and S/Sgt Roger W.Rice.

The remains of S/Sgt.Rice were found buried in the British cemetery of Bergen-op-Zoom. The remains had been picked up by the English from Goes Civilian cemetery (a small town 34 kilometers west of Bergen-op-Zoom).

At first the English exhumed S/Sgt W.Rice believing him to be British. Later it was found that the caretaker had in his possession an identification tag belonging to the subject deceased which was placed with the remains when reburied.

I went to Goes to obtain additional information, but everybody was ignorant of the circumstances surrounding the death of S/Sgt W.Rice.

I then visited Rilland-Bath as mentioned in basic communication. It was found that a two motored plane had crashed into the Oosterschelde between Rilland-Bath and the Island Tholen 16 September 1944 at about 1900 hours. This plane fits the description of the plane in which S/Sgt W.Rice was supposed to have been an occupant. Nothing could be found out about whether parachutes had been seen.

The Germans picked the remains up presumably from the sea shore near Goes and buried them in the civilian cemetery of Goes leaving no information as to the nationality of the deceased or how and where he had been killed.

After obtaining the above information I closed this case.
