Dear Mr. Walsh:

This is to inform you that the remains of your loved one have been permanently interred, as recorded above, side by side with comrades who also gave their lives for their country. Customary military funeral services were conducted over the grave at the time of burial.

After the Department of the Army has completed all final interments, the cemetery will be transferred, as authorized by the Congress, to the care and supervision of the American Battle Monuments Commission. The Commission also will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cemetery, including erection of the permanent headstone. The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. 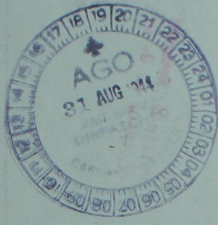

Reference is made to your recent letter requesting information concerning your son, the late Staff Sergeant Thomas I. Walsh, Jr.

A report has been received which shows that burial was made in Cambridge American Military Cemetery, Cambridge, England; Grave 3, Row 2, Plot "H". A Catholic service was conducted at the grave by an Army Chaplain. A temporary marker, with an appropriate inscription thereon, has been erected and the grave properly recorded. The cemetery is well cared for and under the immediate supervision of our military authorities.

A notation has been made on the official records that it is your desire to have your son's remains returned, if possible, to the United States for final interment after the war. At the proper time the legal next of kin will be requested to advise this office of the desired place of final shipment. Steps will then be taken for shipment at Government expense to the place thus designated.

A copy of your letter has been referred to the Chief of Chaplains, Washington, D. C., who will be able to tell you whether or not your son received the last rites of the Roman Catholic Church.

Please accept my heartfelt sympathy and condolence in the loss of your son, and may the meager information which I have furnished be of some comfort in your hour of sorrow.

I am referring to your letter of 5 July 1944, addressed to Brigadier General Samuel E. Anderson, concerning your son, Staff Sergeant Thomas I. Walsh, Jr., which has been forwarded to this office for reply and I am also making further reference to Mr. Walsh's letter of 20 July 1944.

Your desire to know the circumstances attending the death of your son is most understandable. A report has been received in the War Department which discloses that Sergeant Walsh was instantly killed in action on 19 May 1944, when the plane on which he was a crew member, while returning from an operational mission over France, crashed near Ash, Kent, England. Sergeant Walsh was on his twenty-third mission. The report received states that identification was made through the media of his identification tags and a religious medal.

I can assure you that Chaplains are on duty at our bases and that our military personnel are afforded the opportunity of attending to their spiritual welfare before departing on missions.

Since The Quartermaster General, Washington, D. C., has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to the burial of our military personnel who die overseas, a copy of your letter is being forwarded to that official for appropriate attention.

Your inquiry concerning the citations and medals Sergeant Walsh may have been awarded will be the subject of a later communication.

Your son's War Department records show that he was married at Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, on 1 June 1943. His wife's name and address are given as: Mrs. Georgia Ann Walsh, 3017 Northwest 22nd Street, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The authentic proof of Sergeant Walsh's marriage should be procured through civil channels.

MEMORANDUM TO FILE:

Mr. Thomas I. Walsh, Sr. called Captain Galvin from the Union Station and made reference to the case on his son, S/Sgt Thomas I Walsh, Jr.

Captain Galvin stated that he had reviewed the case on his son and since Mr. Walsh had assured us that certified copies of the decree covering full and final divorce proceedings were on file with the Quartermaster General, Washington, D. C. this Bureau would make shipment to the child, Miss Claudia M. Walsh. Mr. Walsh was advised that this property had just been received and that we also had some funds in the amount of \$19.00 belonging to his boy.

Mr. Walsh mentioned that he was informed through reliable source that a S/Sgt Eddie Griffiths of the same organization as that of his son had told someone that he had sent Thomas' wallet with ~~the~~ letter to him and that Mr. Walsh had acknowledged receipt of the wallet. He said that this was not true "I did not receive the wallet nor have I acknowledged receipt of same" I was also informed that this same Sergeant appropriated my son's bicycle, claiming that my boy told him whenever he became missing that the bicycle was his. I know this is not true for I am positive that my son would not make such a statement.

Captain Galvin told Mr. Walsh that we would have the property inventoried immediately and if the wallet was not included in the effects, tracer would be instituted requesting an investigation on the wallet and bicycle.

Mr. Walsh stated that if at any time we needed the Certified Copies of the divorce proceedings, he would be glad to write Washington requesting that they send us a copy.

Captain Galvin assured Mr. Walsh that the check in the amount of \$19.00 and the property would be forwarded to the child at 725 Washington Street, Evanston, Illinois c/o of him.

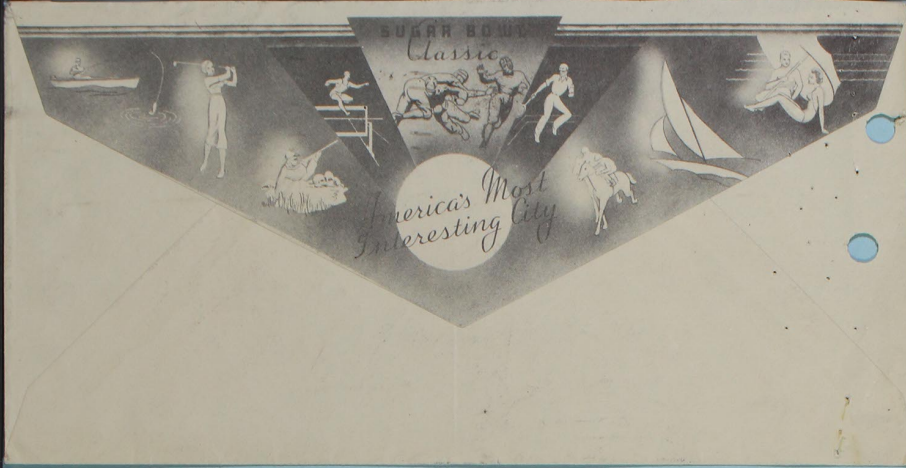
