11 Apr 44 Baled out N of AMIENS We took off from LUDFORD MAGNA at 2230 hrs on 10 Apr 44 in a Lancaster aircraft. At 0300 hrs (11 Apr) I baled out North of AMIENS and, upon landing, hid my parachute, harness and mae west under leaves and earth.

I started to walk in a North-easterly direction and whilst walking I met my navigator, F/O E.J. BURCHELL. We walked for two days, resting during the day time and walking by night.

RAINCHEVAL

Contact with Resistance Movement When we got to PUCHEVILLERS (N.W. EUROPE, 1:250,000, Sheet 5, N 1975) I explained who we were to a labourer and asked if there was any help we could get. We were directed to RAINCHEVAL (N 2177) to a French-Canadian who lived there. We stayed with the French-Canadian for three days. He gave us some civilian clothes and during the three days contacted a resistance group at DOULLENS (N 18) and arranged for us to go there.

DOULLENS

On 16 Apr two men from the group came, with a F/Sgt.
MACAULAY, and fetched us. We were given bicycles and taken
to a house at DOULLENS. There we met S/Sgt. LEIBRING, C.,
U.S.A.A.F. We stayed at this house until 30 Apr, during which
time we were joined by F/O DRAGE. We were all given identity
cards.

/On 30 Apr

O.R.S., Bomber Command, R.A.F. 4 Sep 1944.

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30 Apr 44 AMIENS On 30 Apr we were taken by car in two parties to AMTENS (N 15). BURCHELL and I were taken to one house, the others went elsewhere. We stayed here for two weeks during which time we were joined by 1st Lt. RINKEL, U.S.A.A.F.

On 14 May the three of us were moved to another house, owing to the bombing.

On 21 May we were again moved to a house still in the same district. BURCHELL was moved from there to the country after a short time as his voice was too loud. RINKEL and I stayed there until 31 Aug when the British liberated the town.

I was evacuated via BAYEUK and arrived in the U.K. on 4 Sep 44.
