11 fipr 44 Baled out $N$ of AMIENS

We took off from LUDFORD MAGNA at 2230 hrs on 10 Apr 44 in a. Lencaster aircraft. At $0300 \mathrm{hrs}(11 \mathrm{Apr})$ I baled out North of fantsMs and, upon landing, hio ryy parachute, hariness and mae west under looves and easth.

I started to woll in a North-easterly direction and whilst walking I met my navigetor, F/O E.J. BURCHELI. We walked for two deys, rosting during the day time ond wolking by nigint.

Then we got to PUOHBVILIWRS (N.V. BUROPS, $1: 250,000$, Sheut 5, N 1975) I uxplained who we wore to a labourer and asked if there was any help we could get. We wore directed t. RAINCHEVAL (N 2177) to a Fronch-Canadian who livod there. Wo steyed with the Erench-Gamidian for three dnys. He gave us some civilian elothes and during the three days contected a resistance group at DOULIMNS ( N 18 ) and arronged for us to go thore.

On 16 Apr two men from the group came, with a $F /$ Sgt. MLCAULAY, and fetchod us. We wore given bicycles and teken to a house at DOULLINS. There we met S/Sgt. LEIBRING, C., U.S.h.h.R. To stayed at this house until 30 Apr , during which time we were joinod by F/O DRAGe. Wo were all givon identity cards.

31 lug 44 Contact with British troops

On 30 Apr we were taicen by car in two porties to AMIENS (N 15). BURCHBLL and I were taken to one house, the others went elsuwherc. We stayed here for two woeks during which time we were joinod by 1 st Lt, RINKEL, U.S.N.I.F.

On 14. May the three of us wore moved to another house, owing to tho bombing.

On 21 Many wo were again moved to a house still in the same district. BURCHELL was moved from there to the country aftor a short timo a.s his voice was too loud. RINNSL and I stayed there until 31 lug when the British liberated the town.

I was evacuatod vin BMYUX and arrivod in tho U.K, on 4. Sep 44.

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
